Main Contract Works for Student Hostel at Whitehead, Ma On Shan for City University of Hong Kong

The works involved in this project include: 3 nos. of 13 to 18 stories student residences towers with 2,168 nos. of hostel place for students and a combined 2-storey non-residential podium with common space, canteen, support facilities. Various sustainable construction achievements were carried out in the project, including waste recycling and upcycling, adoption of renewable energy and installation of dust control system. Communication with the community and the neighbourhood as well as adoption of technology make this project more sustainable.



Sustainable Best Practice 1


Haul Road Mist Spray System


Mr. Hung's assistance to install a sprinkler system along the haul road within the project site helps maintain a safe and healthy environment for workers and the surrounding community. Approximately 160m of the haul road was covered with the sprinkler system. The system reduces air pollution and contributes to better respiratory health for workers and the neighbourhood. It fosters positive relationships between the project and its neighbours.

Sustainable Best Practice 2

Effective communication with the neighbourhood

Mr. Hung holds regular meetings with the management offices of the adjacent buildings to discuss site progress, upcoming works, environmental control measures, and their concerns. Mr. Hung coordinated with the project team to notify the client's personnel, residents in the neighbourhood, and community representatives whenever construction works will be carried out during general holidays through WhatsApp. Enquiry hotline is established as well.





Sustainable Best Practice 3

Promotion of technology

Mr. Hung has trained the team to use Gambot. Gambot's chatbot interface allows all stakeholders, including site staff, clients, and subcontractors, to easily submit environmental observations, fostering a culture of on-site issue reporting, Mr. Hung receives notification from Gambot via phone, so prompt rectification targeting the reported issue will be done. Gambot allows mosquito service providers to upload mosquito control record to the system so no paper will be needed for report.
